STAFF REPORT



Visitor Services reported a successful 2024 year, highlighting three pillars of engagement:

- Visitor Centre: Hosted 2,300 visitors, a 52% increase over 2023.
- Mobile Outreach: Engaged 8,700 visitors, up 23% from last year.
- Digital Engagement: Social media posts saw 45,500 impressions, live chat assisting 138 users, QR scans up 155% with 776, website page views 61,155.
