INTRODUCTION OF BYLAWS



Zoning Bylaw Correction – Carriage Lane

A revised zoning bylaw was updated for 481 Highway 97B NE (Carriage Lane) to correct an earlier error and ensure compatibility with the new provincial small-scale multi-unit housing regulations (Bill 44). The new zoning enables the addition of secondary suites on the existing manufactured home lots.
